

Limited functioning of company bodies

In connection with the increasing wave of SARS-Cov-2 (Coronavirus) infections in Poland and other countries and the growing epidemiological threat, <u>the authorities have issued a regulation declar-ing an epidemic state of emergency in the territory of the Republic of Poland</u>, which has made it necessary for businesses to take non-standard precautions.

A number of restrictions have been introduced, either in terms of movement (e.g. <u>ban on foreigners entering Poland</u>) or in <u>terms of gatherings (e.g. ban on over 50 people gathering</u>). In this complex situation, it may be difficult to meet contradictory obligations, on the one hand resulting from the exceptional situation and related regulations (restrictions), and on the other hand from "normal" company operations (obligations). As an example, the time when <u>annual shareholders' meetings have to be held is approaching</u>, and many companies have considerably more than 50 shareholders.

Private sector entitles have recently taken a number of preventive measures, particularly closing offices, sending all or some staff (including management board members) home to work remotely, restricting business trips and business meetings. We are aware that this situation may have a number of negative consequences for your business operations, certainly a negative impact on the ability of management board members to perform their functions.

Given the above, we would like to offer you **legal solutions** that will allow you to mitigate to some extent the effects of the Coronavirus. The proposed solutions are addressed to all businesses, including companies, particularly entities which do not have more than two management board members. At this difficult time, we can offer you our assistance with **preparing appropriate documentation for acting on the company's behalf (powers of attorney and documentation related to the appointment of proxies, especially if the management board members are permanently abroad), allowing us to secure as far as possible the operational capabilities of the management board of action on the part of the company during the Coronavirus outbreak.**
